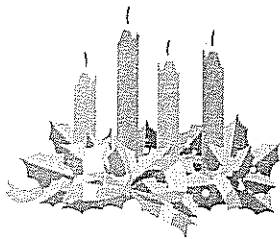

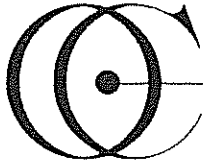

Injectable and nasal mist vaccine will be available **by appointment only** at these clinics.
Call 832-5100 during regular business hours for an appointment.

This clinic is for individuals in the following priority groups – **newly expanded**:

- Pregnant women
- **All Children and young adults ages 6 months-24 years old**
- Persons who live with or provide care for infants under 6 months of age
- Health care workers and Emergency Medical Personnel with direct patient contact
- **Adults between the ages of 25 – 64, who have underlying medical conditions which put them at higher risk for influenza-related complications.**

There is no charge for H1N1 vaccination

Please note:

BY APPOINTMENT ONLY – CALL 832-5100 FOR AN APPOINTMENT

Children under 18 must have a parent or legal guardian sign the consent form


Persons with allergy to eggs or seasonal influenza vaccine should not take the H1N1 vaccine

Do not come to the vaccination clinic if you have a fever over 100 degrees F.


Please wear a short sleeve shirt

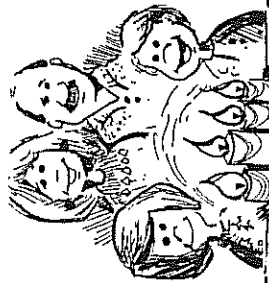
