[Wisconsin DPI and Wisconsin DHS](#) has partnered to offer onsite COVID-19 testing in schools free of charge. Holy Spirit has enrolled in this and we were partnered up with Novir as our testing vendor.

- School testing is another layer of protection for students, teachers, and school staff.
- Testing is quick, easy, and it is not painful.
- A one-time consent form will allow students to participate in the testing program.

**Who** will we be offering tests to?

- At this point, all symptomatic students, staff and staff family members.

**What** test(s) will we offer?

- Novir will be administering rapid antigen tests. Holy Spirit staff will not be administering the tests.

**When** will we be offering testing?

- Testing will begin on Monday, October 18, 2021 from 8:00-9:00AM.
- Testing will continue Monday-Friday from 8:00-9:00AM.

**Where** will we be offering testing?

- Testing will be done entering the Scrip door on the southwest side of school building (by the church) near the front of school.
- Students and staff do not need to make an appointment. Testing will be done as a first come, first serve basis. However, they must first sign up and provide consent for testing.

Does my child have to be tested using this vendor at school?

- No. If your child has symptoms in line with COVID-19, they will need to be tested. Testing can be done at any local community testing site or at this school site. The school testing site is simply for the convenience of families to quickly test and get results.
- If an outbreak occurs in my child's classroom (two or more lab-confirmed COVID-19 cases), Holy Spirit may ask that all consenting students and staff be tested from that classroom.

What is the organization code?

**Why** are we doing this?

- Testing helps reduce community spread and keeps our school operating safely.
- We want to help prevent school outbreaks and the spread of COVID-19 in the school and in the community.
- Providing a quick and easy way for parents to have their child(ren) tested, can help keep all children in-person learning as much as possible. Which is what we all want.
